

Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area

- → Project overview:
 - Restore and preserve cultural and natural resources in and around the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area.
- → Work breakdown:
 - Restore buildings and grounds (70%)
 - Collect data related to restoration and preservation (10%)
 - Provide public outreach and education (15%)
 - Office work, community building (5%)
- Initial work focused on stabilizing and restoring Camp Ken-Etiwa-Pec (KEP)
 - Window/door repair and replacement
 - Framing, interior and exterior painting
 - Wall sheathing (paneling and drywall)
 - Masonry and roof repair
