




Collections Donation Form



Thank you for your interest in making a donation to the Fort Monroe Authority! Each piece of our collection tells a story, and donations like yours help Fort Monroe to tell new stories and expand the ones we know. Items are added to a museum's collection through a process called *accessioning* in which staff members decide whether to take legal and intellectual ownership of an object.

The decision to accept, or accession, an item is based on the following criteria:

- Relevance of the artifact to the history of those who have inhabited the land currently occupied by the Authority. We are interested in materials that represent the layered history of this particular place, from the thousands of years of Indigenous occupation up to the evolving military installation and its concomitant communities.
- Condition of the object, as well as our ability to care for and store it
- Presence or absence of similar or identical items already housed in the collection

If your object is accepted, you must sign a Deed of Gift that transfers legal ownership of the object to the Fort Monroe Authority.

What condition is the material currently in? Is it damaged or worn? How did this damage occur? Please described any known repair work, modifications, or restorations.

6. Object History

Please provide any additional information, stories, anecdotes, about this particular object.

7. What is your (the Donor's) relationship to the original owner or to the chain of ownership?
